SPEAKER SPOTLIGHT:

Mr. Massey Villarreal

Mr. Massey Villarreal is CEO and President of Precision Task Group, Inc., (PTG). PTG is a Hispanic-owned and managed computer consulting firm providing data processing solutions to public and private sector firms.

Mr. Villarreal is a catalyst for community service and political involvement. Mr. Villarreal was the first person to ever serve as chairman of a local, state, and national Hispanic chamber when he served as chairman of the Houston Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, the Texas Association of Mexican American Chambers of Commerce (TAMACC) based in Austin Texas, and the United States Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (USHCC).

In addition to his business interest, Mr. Villarreal served a four year term as Chairman of the Board for the Republican National Hispanic Assembly (RNHA), named National Hispanic Vice-Chairman of the Bush/Cheney for President Campaign and Deputy Vice Chairman of

the Republican National Convention in Philadelphia PA in 2000, and is currently serving on the National Steering Committee for the Viva Bush Campaign. In September 2003, Mr. Villarreal was appointed by Governor Perry as Chairman of the governing board of the Texas Department of Economic Development.

In October 2002, Hispanic Business Magazine named Massey Villarreal as one of the one hundred most influential Hispanics in the United States.

Mr. Villarreal's presentation will be entitled "The Hispanic Journey: Where we have been and where we need to be."
